

Extension ideas:

Extension: Can you make a tally chart of which minibeasts come to visit your bug hotel?

Extension: Can you find out about and draw the lifecycle of one of the creatures that comes to visit your bug hotel or garden? e.g. a butterfly or a froq.

Suggested resources:

- plastic bottles cut in half to make tubes
- bamboo sticks
- bark
- twigs, leaves, grass and any other natural materials you find in your garden
- soil
- stones and rocks
- plant pots

- Card
