



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PUPILS REPRESENTING THE SCHOOL AT SPORTING EVENTS

We want everyone to enjoy their time representing the school at sporting events. For this reason, we have written this Code of Conduct to set out our behaviour expectations for you and your parents/guardians to read together, discuss and sign.

THE BEHAVIOUR EXPECTED:

Before we go, your behaviour in school - in lessons, on the playground, on trips and at clubs - should show us that you understand this. Event leads reserve the right not to take a child who consistently behaves inappropriately in school and does not show the school values.

At the sporting event, we expect you to show the school values at all times and act in a safe and responsible way, with respect for others. Examples of how you can show the school values:

Belonging: Cheer on your classmates and make them feel good about their efforts!

Resilience: Try not to give up even when it feels hard.

Assurance: Have confidence in your own ability and a positive mind set.

Independence & Integrity: Ensure you have what you need for the event and follow the rules fairly of the game.

No Limits: Try your best and have fun at the same time!

Whilst at the event, staff will handle the following problems promptly and fairly:

- Disruptive behaviour, i.e. bad language, vandalism, fighting, bullying, rudeness;
- Refusing reasonable requests by adults;
- Not showing sporting behaviour such as fair play and honesty; and
- Not showing school values towards pupils from other schools, members of the public/local community or your peers.

If, once selected, your behaviour at school is not acceptable for any reason, you will be reminded of this Code of Conduct and if there are any further incidents of poor behaviour, you will lose your place in the sporting event.

Whilst at the event, if you act inappropriately or poor behaviour continues once you have been spoken to, the staff on the trip will phone your parents/guardians and the school reserve the right to ask your parents to collect you and take you home. We expect all children representing the school to try their best at all times, behaviour included.

CONSEQUENCES FOR POOR BEHAVIOUR AT THE SPORTING EVENT MAY INCLUDE:

- Quiet times or Time outs;
- Restriction or removal from an activity;
- Talk with a member of staff and / or phone call home;
- Consequence when back in school; or
- Parents picking you up from the trip and taking you home.
