We would like to welcome you to Year One at Thameside Primary School. We are ready to help you and your child embark upon the next part of their learning journey.





Continuous Prevision in Year 1





A typical school day:

- School gates open before 8.45am
- Gates close at 8.55am and the register is taken. Children arriving after the doors have closed will need to be signed in at the office and will be marked as late.
- Early work starts at 8.45am.
- Lunch Break starts at 12:00pm and finishes at 1:00pm
- The afternoon typically includes wider curriculum lessons.
- School ends at 3.15p.m.

Reading in Year

Your child will bring home a reading book, their target card and the yellow reading record, which should be kept in their book bag for protection.

Reading bookbag books are usually changed every week as they progress and phonics books will be allocated weekly.

Throughout Key Stage 1, we would like you to read with your child for a minimum of 10 minutes each day. Please comment or simply sign the reading record to confirm that your child has read with you.

Children will also receive a weekly phonics e-book, which is set through the Oxford Owl website. Your child will have their own log in and password. Please practice this book each week, as it will reinforce their phonics learning.




