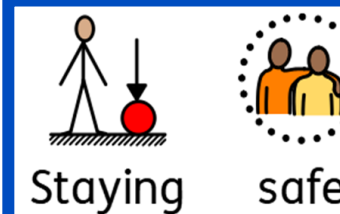
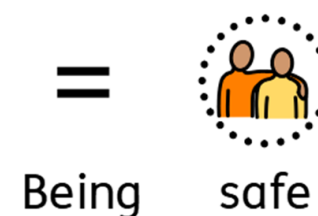

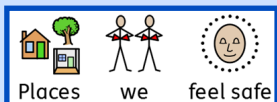

Is it bullying?

Bullying is when someone means to hurt or upset you on purpose

Bullying is when it keeps on happening

Bullying is when you cannot get the hurt to stop



Bullying is never okay. This includes bullying in person, online, because of someone's appearance, race, religion, disability, family, gender or sexuality.
